Services: YOGA, Trauma-Informed Parent Group, Spiritual Support, Court Preparation, and VOICES Peer Support



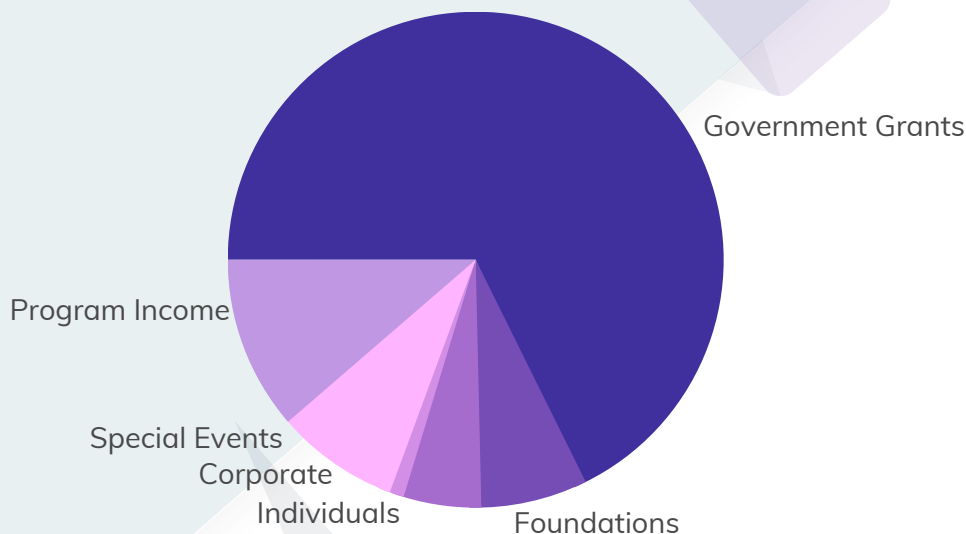

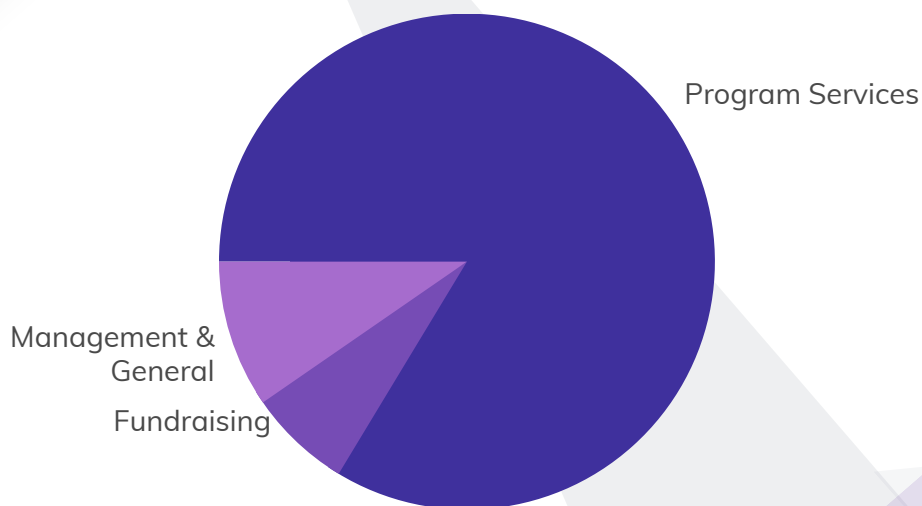
