What is Crime Stoppers?

Crime Stoppers is an organization formed in an effort to **HELP CURB CRIME**. Individuals contacting Crime Stoppers with information leading to the arrest of a person or persons involved in felony offenses will be paid a cash reward. Crime Stoppers is **COMPLETELY CONFIDENTIAL** and informants are never required to give their names or personal information.



How Does Crime Stoppers Work?

PART 1: CONTACT

The Crime Stoppers hotline, **817-469-TIPS** (8477), website and mobile apps are operated by the Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County Call Center.

PART 2: TIP SUBMISSION

Personnel take calls, online and mobile app submissions and then **DISSEMINATE THE TIP INFORMATION** to the appropriate law enforcement agency or school for **INVESTIGATION**.

PART 3: ANONYMITY

Callers do not have to identify themselves. Every tipster remains **100% ANONYMOUS** and will receive a tip number to be used in all future correspondence.

PART 4: REWARD \$

A reward of **UP TO \$1,000** will be offered to anyone who provides a **TIP THAT LEADS TO AN ARREST** for a crime or a criminal case that is cleared.

What is Friends for Life?

The FFL program encourages students to make healthy decisions and ask for help when they or their friends are in need. FFL focuses on behaviors and issues that can place the student and others at risk and serves as a resource for students who want to report concerns regarding fellow students and still remain anonymous.



Where did FFL come from?

Friends for Life began in 2010 as a pilot project along with Fort Worth ISD's It's Not Okay (INOK) program.



What topics does FFL cover?

Topics covered through FFL include bullying, cyberbullying, sexting, dating violence, family violence, gang activity, sexual harassment on & off campus, self-harm, & suicidal tendencies.



How are reports handled?

Reports are first received by the Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County Call Center that is available 365 days a year. Reports are then passed on to a school counselor, interventionist, administrator, or law enforcement (when necessary).



Is it really anonymous?

Yes! FFL tips are covered by state law (TX Government Code, Sec. 414.009) and satisfies the part of David's Law requiring the creation of an anonymous reporting system in schools.

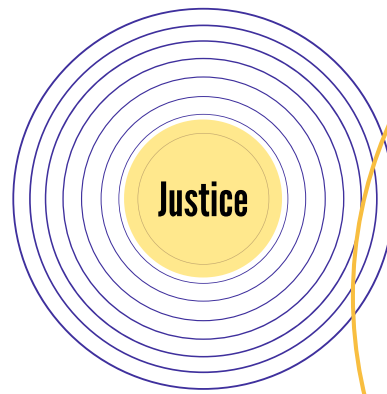


About the Bike Patrol Support Group

The Police Bike Support Group is a committee of One Safe Place, the Tarrant County Crime Prevention Agency. The PBSG assists officers of the Fort Worth Police Bike Patrol Unit and other bike-certified officers across the department by providing equipment, uniforms, special training, and recognition. Through community oriented programs the PBSG promotes the value of bike patrol to the city of Fort Worth. In addition the PBSG also funds the annual police civilian awards banquet, retirement awards for the police civilian employees, special crime prevention initiatives and other special requests from the department. The PBSG only accepts funding requests for things that are not typically funded in the annual police department budget.

The Bike Patrol Support Group operates under the direction of a Board of Trustees and the Board meets monthly at the One Safe Place offices at 1100 Hemphill St. in Fort Worth. The PBSG currently has an annual budget of approximately \$245,000, mainly through individual contributions and two major fundraisers held each year. The first fundraiser, usually held in May, is Big Guns in Cowtown held at Del Frisco's in Fort Worth. The second fundraiser is the Shoot for the Blue Sporting Clay Shoot held each October at the Beaumont Ranch in Grandview, Texas.

In addition to providing specialized equipment, the PBSG sends Fort Worth Police bicycle officers to advanced bicycle training and certification programs, provides special recognition awards and conducts an annual awards banquet/picnic to recognize outstanding performance.

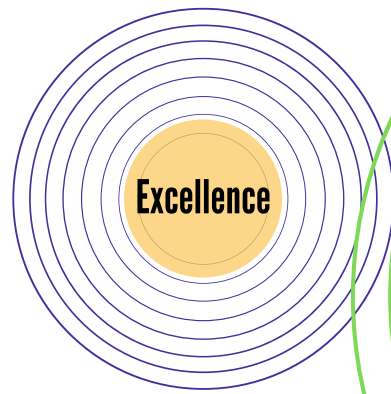

The **Imagine No Violence** campaign was launched with an event held at Bass Hall in November 2001. More than 1,200 high school students gathered at the event, with delegations from each Fort Worth ISD high school reporting on their concepts of "Imagining No Violence". In several follow-up meetings, students developed the idea of promoting nonviolence through the creation of original artwork--thus the Imagine No Violence art contest was born.

Step 2 Risk Assessment

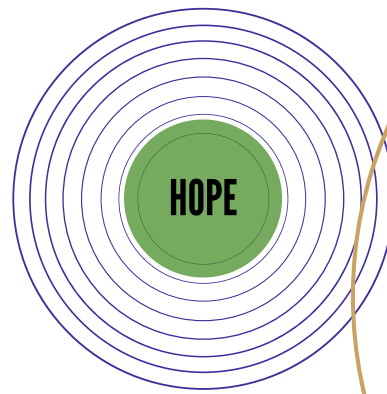
Many of our clients are not fully aware of the dangers they face. We will assess your situation to determine your level of risk.

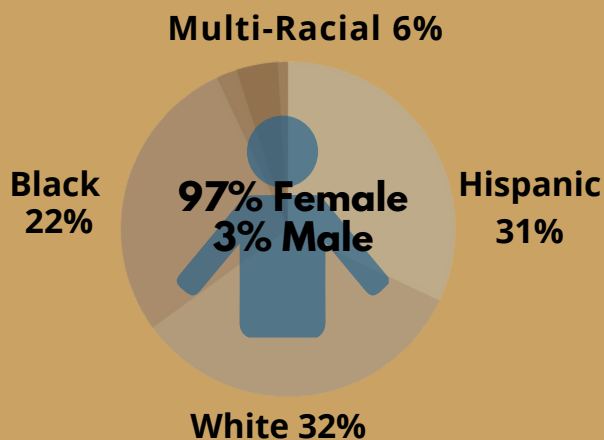
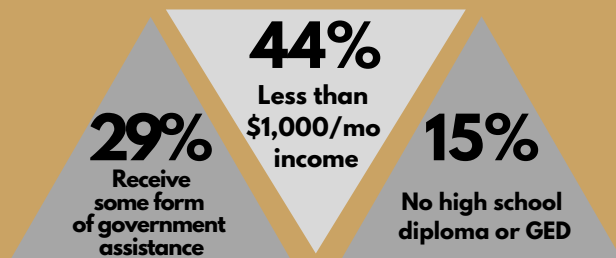
